Wastewater Project

The City of Dufur is beginning the first phase of a wastewater system improvements project. The purpose of the first phase of the project is to update the existing wastewater effluent center pivot irrigation system and to remove sewage sludge from the wastewater treatment lagoon, Cell No. 1. The City treats its wastewater at the Wastewater Treatment Facility located East of Hogans Alley. The wastewater is irrigated in the summer months and discharged to Fifteenmile Creek in the winter months. The existing irrigation system is problematic and in need of replacement. The sewage sludge that has accumulated in the treatment lagoon needs to be removed to prepare for the upcoming phases of the wastewater system improvements project that will involve construction of new wastewater treatment lagoons.

During the removal of sewage sludge there is the potential for objectional odors to occur. Large dump trucks will be driving through town both to and from the park and we ask for your extra diligence with safe driving during this time.

On behalf of the City of Dufur, I would like to thank you for your patience and cooperation during this critical project for the City. The improvements that we are making will serve the City for many years to come.



Express Bill Pay

Online payments are finally here! Express Bill Pay will be ready to go in September for residents who would like to pay their water & sewer bill online, or set up auto-pay.

All you need is an internet connection through a web browser and an email address.

Every month you'll receive a reminder email to let you know when your bill is online. Then, you just log into your account at xpressbillpay.com and view your bill.

When you're ready to pay your bill, select a payment type. You can pay with credit card, debit card, or electronic funds transfer. Enter the information and you're done!

New Water Meters Coming Soon!

The City of Dufur received 140K from the CARES act for infrastructure projects. Council voted to spend these funds on new digital meters.

Installation will be done by contractors sometime this Fall.

The new meters will have improved accuracy and will enable public works to read meters year-round.

Water and Sewer Rate Increase effective November 1st, 2022

Prior to Covid, the City of Dufur was 2 years in to a 3year rate increase plan for water & sewer service. The last increase was in October 2019, which was the second of three increases. These new rates helped the City qualify for grant funding to replace our aging sewer and water infrastructure. The forthcoming increase will add an additional 10% to water cost and a flat rate of \$10 to sewer. This is the last of the 3 increases.

Dufur Recreation District Receives Oregon State Parks & Recreation Grant

Dufur City Park's Pool Resurfacing Project was completed in time for 2022 swim season – it is being very well used this summer!

Dufur Recreation District coupled a \$181,536 grant award from the Oregon Parks & Recreation Department's Local Government Grant Program with District funds to resurface the pool with materials to extend the life of our 81-year-old pool. The project included additional pool decking, upgrading mechanics and new fencing.

Looking forward, the District has applied for another grant with Oregon Parks & Recreation for \$470,400 – this project will include a new ADA compliant bathhouse, parking improvements and a splash park. The District received \$200,000 from Wasco County ARPA Funds for "infrastructure"; we will use these funds as a match to the OPRD grant funds if awarded.

Dufur Pool has been frequented for generations by the community's residents and visitors. The Pool brings community members from the area together to play and exercise. With many families located in the area, the Dufur Recreation District is happy to be able to continue to provide this service to the community.

OPRD gives more than \$6 million annually to Oregon communities for outdoor recreation projects, and has awarded over \$70 million in grants across the state since 1999. The grants are funded from voterapproved Lottery money. In the 2020 grant cycle, OPRD awarded \$4,036,089 in large grants to 7 entities; the cycle includes matching funds of \$8,103,212 for projects totaling \$12,139,301!

Dufur Recreation District's mission is to enrich the quality of life for the Dufur community by preserving and enhancing recreational opportunities and open space. This grant and this project will improve the swimming facilities for today, and help preserve it for future generations. Before:


Dufur School & Community Library

November 2022 Election

There are three council positions (#2, #4 and #6) that are available for the November 2022 Election, as well as Mayor.

To qualify for a seat on council, candidates must be a registered voter, reside within Dufur city limits, and be a resident of Dufur for one year or more.

There are two options when filing for a position: Pay a \$10 filing fee, or file by petition by gathering 10 signatures. (Signatures must come from residents of Dufur, who are registered voters)

Applications can be picked up and turned in at Dufur City Hall. The deadline for applications is 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 25th.
